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### Why Cherrybrook Technology High School?

Cherrybrook Technology High School is a truly comprehensive, coeducational Government technology high school, which aims to give all students the best opportunity to reach their potential in a caring, safe, technologically advanced environment. The facilities in the school are second to none, including a magnificent multi-purpose building which opened in 2018, a technologically equipped MPC (school hall), lecture theatre, power systems garage and drama rooms, which are the envy of many schools. A new STEM building is currently under construction and will be opening in 2024.

### **Academic Success**

Cherrybrook Technology High School has an outstanding tradition of academic success. In 2022 students achieved outstanding results in the HSC. These included:



- Sixteen students on the Premier's All Rounders list
- Six students with an ATAR greater than 99
- At least 98 students scored an ATAR greater than 90
- Five students who achieved a state placing in five separate courses of study
- 316 Band 6 results were achieved by 134 students in over 40 HSC courses.

Our Year 7 and 9 students also achieve results well above State and National average in the NAPLAN and Year 8 in Science VALID Tests.

Students in all years successfully participate annually in the Australian National competitions in a variety of subjects, with many of our students receiving distinction awards.







### **Curriculum Choice**

Cherrybrook Technology High School offers an extraordinarily extensive curriculum integrating advanced technology into all courses of study.

 Students in Years 7 and 8 follow a fixed curriculum, which includes English, Mathematics, Science, History, Geography, Technology, Personal Development, Health and Physical Education (PDHPE), Language (French, Chinese and Japanese), Music, Drama and Computing Skills



- Year 9 and 10 students study the core courses of English, Mathematics, Science, PDHPE, History and Geography, as well as a huge choice of elective courses, building toward the Record of School Achievement (RoSA)
- An enormous range of courses are offered in the senior school, including academic courses, such as Extension 2 in Mathematics and English, as well as vocational courses such as Hospitality and Building and Construction.



### **Sporting Opportunities**

CTHS sport features:



- A strong house system for our three important school Carnivals: Swimming, Cross Country and Athletics
- Many knockout teams catering for a huge variety of sports
- Gala Days for students in Years 7 and 8
- Grade sport played against other schools for students in Years 9 to 12, as well as a range of interest sports
- Student eligibility for Zone, Regional and State selection in over twenty sports.

In 2022, students achieved outstanding results in a variety of sporting activities including many impressive individual student achievements.



### **Cultural Opportunity**

Students are also actively encouraged to participate in debating and public speaking, areas

of development which provide vital confidence to students for school and post school life.

CTHS has many different Music Ensembles including Bands, Choir, Guitar, String and Percussion. The school produces either a musical or a major drama production annually and encourages all students to participate in music, dance and drama activities.

Opportunities also exist for students to participate in a range of Visual Arts and Multimedia competitions.

Students in Years 9 to 12 may be able to participate in the International Study Tours to France or Japan. Students spend some time with a host family and are able to experience the culture first hand.







### Student Wellbeing, Leadership and Support

A transparent and comprehensive Wellbeing Scheme is one of CTHS's great strengths, providing a clear Awards Scheme, fair but firm consequences for inappropriate behaviour and a strong student support network, which incorporates programs for selected students in mathematics and literacy. Other features include a strong Peer Support Scheme and a Student Leadership Program, which includes a dynamic Student Representative Council (SRC).

These programs are supported by a Wellbeing Team, which is comprised of the Stage Head Teachers, Head Teacher Wellbeing, Head Teacher Student Programs, School Counsellors, Learning Support Teacher, Student Support Officer, Careers Advisers and Year Advisers for each grade and other interested parties, who meet on a regular basis to support students.

Monday 6 March 2023	DoE primary schools issue parents or caregivers with the Expression of Interest hardcopy or link to digital Expression of Interest for placement in Year 7 at NSW Government Secondary School.
Friday 24 March 2023	<ul> <li>DoE Year 6 students' parents or caregivers complete the <i>Expression of Interest for Placement in Year 7</i> form and return it to their child's primary school.</li> <li>Non-Government Year 6 students' parents or caregivers complete the <i>Expression of Interest for Placement in Year 7</i> form, downloaded via the following link and return it to CTHS.</li> <li><a href="https://education.nsw.gov.au/public-schools/going-to-a-public-school/enrolment/high-school-enrolment">https://education.nsw.gov.au/public-schools/going-to-a-public-school/enrolment/high-school-enrolment</a></li> </ul>
Friday 19 May 2023	CTHS Enrolment Committee meets and reviews all applications. The CTHS Enrolment Committee uses the criteria stated on the CTHS website for non-local enrolments.
Friday 26 May 2023	<ul> <li>Successful and unsuccessful applicants will be notified by mail.</li> <li>Parents or caregivers of successful applicants will be sent an <i>Application to Enrol in a NSW Government School Form</i> and an application for the Year 7 High Potential and Gifted class.</li> </ul>
Friday 9 June 2023	<ul> <li>Parents or caregivers confirm enrolment at CTHS by returning their completed Application to Enrol in a NSW Government School Form and all required supporting documents.</li> </ul>
Friday 21 July 2023	Students applying for the Year 7 HPGE class must also return the completed application, support material and payment.
Saturday 5 August 2023	Test for Year 7 HPGE class to be held at CTHS.
Friday 1 September 2023	CTHS Acceptance emailed to parents or caregivers confirming enrolment at CTHS.
Friday 27 October 2023	Students applying for the HPGE class will be notified of placement in this class.
Friday 3 November 2023	An Information Package will be sent to parents or caregivers about Orientation Day and Year 7 Camp
Tuesday 28 November 2023	Year 6 into 7 Orientation Day at CTHS from 9.00am to 11.00am. ALL students AND parents or caregivers are expected to attend.

When returning the *Application to Enrol in a NSW Government School* form you must submit documents, which confirm your home address within our drawing area. You will be required to provide documents which add up to a minimum of 100 points.

### **Guidelines:**

- All documents MUST be in the name of the enrolling parent / carer and show the child's address
- > Applications must contain ONE Category A document
- All documents must be **current** (dated within the last three months).

### **Rental Agreements**

If your rental agreement expires during 2024 you will be required to resubmit a current lease agreement.

### What happens if you move out of the local area?

Local area enrolments who move out of the area will have to write to the Principal requesting a review of their enrolment. This will be assessed by the CTHS Enrolments Committee and may result in a reversal of the original decision to accept your child at CTHS. In this situation, your child may have to leave this school and enrol at their local high school.

### **Out-of-area Schools / Non-local Applications**

Parents may apply to enrol their child at CTHS if they live outside the enrolment area. A map of the drawing area can be found on the CTHS website and in this booklet.

Non-local applications will be considered by the CTHS Enrolment Committee, according to the DoE policy and the school procedures. The CTHS Enrolment Committee will review each application on its own merits and will only consider information included in the supporting documents provided to the school. In some circumstances the Enrolment Panel may request additional documentation to support enrolment applications.

If you live outside the local enrolment area, you must complete Part C of the *Expression of Interest for Placement in Year 7* form. You may also wish to attach additional supporting documents.

It is important to note that giving false or misleading information is a serious offence. In the event that statements made in your application later prove to be false or misleading, any decision made as a result of the application may be reversed.

If you are dissatisfied with the outcome and feel you have not been treated fairly or the result is unreasonable, you may lodge an appeal. The appeal should be made in writing to the Principal.
