Software Specifications

The device must meet all the following requirements:

Operating System	Microsoft Windows 10/11 Apple MacOS 10.15 (Catalina) or newer Note: Android-based devices, Chromebooks and iPads are intentionally omitted from this document, as they are unable to meet all the requirements of a learning device. Microsoft 365 (Office) and some Adobe products are provided to all DoE students free of charge. Education Software	Web browser e.g. Microsoft Edge, Google Chrome, Mozilla Firefox, Safari. Microsoft 365 (available for free with DoE student account). Adobe Creative Cloud (available for free with DoE student account). Additional subject-specific software may be required.
Backup	External drive or cloud-based backup solution e.g. Google Drive, OneDrive (both are accessible via the DoE Student Portal). Students must ensure that their files are regularly backed up.
Security Software	Windows laptops should run Windows Defender (inbuilt with Windows) or alternative. Note: Mac laptops do not come with inbuilt Antivirus so this needs to be installed by user. Antivirus and antimalware programs must be kept up to date to be effective. Many Windows laptops come with a 3 month McAfee or Norton trial. Be aware that once the trial expires the laptop is no longer secure so the software should be removed if it hasn't been purchased so that Windows Defender may become the active Antivirus program.
