To all Year 8 Parents,

Library Redesign

With plans to redesign the library's space and resources, our current focus is to visit a selected number of recently redesigned and refurbished secondary school libraries, to consult their staff about the process and challenges of the brief, to look at the results for ourselves and to discuss with the staff the pros and cons of what they achieved.

Teaching in the Library

We are currently involved in two teaching projects with 7T, the first as part of the English program focusses on Shakespeare's life and times. 

PROCEDURE FOR EARLY LEAVERS
