Deputy Principal Conference

On Thursday and Friday last week, the Deputy Principals all attended the Annual Secondary Deputy Principals' Conference, which was held in Wollongong. The two days featured several key note speakers and workshops focussing on current issues in education. Highlights from the conference included:

- Dame Pat Collarbone explored the changes in the world of education and their impact on school leadership
- Professor Jenny Gore shared research on equity and quality in education
- Jonathon Nicholas delivered a particularly helpful and informative presentation focussing on the mental health of young people in Australia
- Jane Caro presented an address focussing on media and social media and the perceptions that young people glean from the media.

The workshops featured interesting and informative topics including developing the school plan, teacher accreditation, effective leadership, school staffing, school finances, wellbeing, mindfulness, bullying and management of serious incidents. The two days were excellent in terms of developing the planning processes for the school and strategies to assist student wellbeing and learning.



Year 7 and 8 Public Speaking

"A good orator is pointed and impassioned" - Marcus T Cicero

The Year 7 and 8 Public Speaking is one of my favourite events on the Cherrybrook Technology High School calendar and, as I teach famous speeches as one of my HSC texts, I am very aware of all the elements of good oratory. It is, as Cicero said, the ability to be 'pointed'; to take and make a point, and 'impassioned'; to make it real for the audience. I can confidently say every speaker in this final lived this dream and made their point, delivering it in an appropriately passionate way for their speech.

The Year 7 competition was won this year by Elizabeth Miezis for her speech on *Being a Teenager*. Elizabeth cleverly appealed to both students and parents. She used anecdotes, research and the 'daggy' recollections of her very embarrassed parents. Her quote: "Having a child is like getting a tattoo, you better be ready to commit," was an excellent setting to her speech. The runner-up for this competition was Shaariq Ali for his speech on Instagram photos and what they mean. It was not only his clever delivery that captured the audience, but also how he showed that each Instagram photo revealed a social insecurity. All speakers should be commended, as any one of them could have won this competition for their impassioned and pointed delivery.

Redah Sheriff connected with the excellent spirit of last week's International Day, in her speech on *The Beautiful and Positive Face of Australian Multiculturalism.* Next, Alina Chieh spoke about the very real and very scary facts surrounding people who drink drive and how they impact upon people like you and me. Jessica Phillips then presented a very clever and relevant speech on *Being Ungrateful.* She included research, but grounded it on the realisation that we all need to be grateful for our lives and experiences. Daniel Monterio presented an esoteric speech on lying or telling half-truths. His use of humour and his clever ending, placed his speech as a close contender for the winner of this year's competition. The final Year 7 speaker was Sally Song, who spoke about coming to Australia and residing here. Sally must be congratulated for her commitment speech which reminded us of many migrants' search for balance, harmony and peace.

The Year 8 competition was so close that an extended period of deliberation was needed to decide the winner. The competition was awarded to Danre Bekker, who began his speech with the relatable quote: "English is a crazy language and it's driving me nuts." The runners-up included Maxwell Ward, whose humorous and compelling speech on pick-up lines implored females to understand the anguish of the male's approach to women. It was clever, engaging and relevant to students and parents. Aurora Henke was also a close contender with her incredibly dramatic performance speech on *Selfies*. Her ability to engage the audience and her effective use of humour was greatly received. Hemanshi Kumar selected the topic of *Teenagers and Technology*, giving an interesting speech on teenagers today and the impact of technology on them. Her message, *to Believe in Yourself* was a strong reminder of how easy it is to lose yourself in the endless on-line connections.

Arzaan Mirza showed us that the future of the world is in good hands. He reminded us of gruesome images on TV caused by hatred and violence but passionately presented an optimism for peace and harmony that was very affirming. Colaina Raccani's speech on teachers was so thoughtful and amusing I wanted her to present it to the whole staff. At first she mocked the teachers who set homework after everyone has packed up after the bell had rung and wondered why no one had completed it, but her conclusion was to thank teachers for all the effort they put into their work. Russell Lee's speech on *Obedience* started with a story of him being naughty, but moved into a mature and thoughtful representation of whether obedience, and blind obedience, is a good thing? The final speaker of the evening was Matthew Barrett, whose clever presentation on telling the truth and the implications of lying in our lives, was a fitting conclusion to an excellent evening.

All speakers must be congratulated on their effort and expertise and every member of the English KLA thanked for perpetuating such a strong culture of speaking throughout the school. As the organiser of the whole competition, Mrs Granziera, also deserves our gratitude and thanks.

PROCEDURE FOR SICK STUDENTS

Year 12 Food Technology - Mystery Box Challenge

As the course for food technology draws to a close, it is time for lessons which challenge and extend student learning. With this in mind, last Monday students, working in teams of four, produced a two course meal from a variety of basic ingredients, using lesser amounts of additional ingredients, which could be similar to 'left overs' you may have in the fridge at home, separated into savoury and sweet.


