








# School Carparks



# Year 12 Careers Night - Tertiary Career Options Evening



SRS is a program enabling institutions to make early offers to students using criteria other than or in addition to the ATAR, such as school recommendations, senior secondary studies and personal awards and achievements. Most of UAC's participating institutions have Educational Access Schemes (EAS) to help students who have experienced long-term educational disadvantage gain admission to tertiary study. To be eligible for EAS consideration, student educational performance must have been seriously affected for a period of at least six months during Year 11 and/or 12 or equivalent, due to circumstances beyond their control and choosing. 
