DEPUTY PRINCIPAL'S REPORT



Building Project

After five long months at Council, we can finally say that the CTHS Building Project was approved late last week. The Department of Education released the tender for the contract on Wednesday, which means all is going well. This will be finalised prior to the end of the year allowing work to commence in early January. Unfortunately, the Department has also advised we will no longer be receiving the two storey semi-permanent building, which was to be an additional structure allocated to us earlier this year. Hopefully, we will receive a suitable alternative, as we have already completed significant planning to utilise these spaces.

Swimming Carnival

After two summer scorchers on Monday and Tuesday, Wednesday served up an absolute scorcher for the Swimming Carnival, which was held at Parramatta Pool for the second and final time. Parramatta Pool has been slated for redevelopment and as a result, the PE staff are on the look-out for a new venue for next year. That being said, the Carnival was a resounding success, with excellent participation from students. Crowds marvelled at the competitions, particularly the relays, with everyone cheering on their favourite team. Year 11/12 students were suitably 'Hawaiian' as per their theme for the day and there were many outfits which were absolutely outstanding. The 'lizard' lane was again enormously popular and the competitive spirit of the racers was impressive. Charles won the Carnival on the day, although the final result will not be known until the Year 7 Carnival early next year. Optus Telecommunication Tower Proposal

Last week the school received correspondence stating Optus has proposed the development of a Mobile Phone Base Tower opposite the school. The Department of Education has been informed of this proposal and has corresponded with the developer citing a number of concerns.

The Department of Education has a Policy of Avoidance in relation to mobile towers as outlined below:

The Policy states:

"The Department of Education adopts a policy of prudent avoidance in relation to the installation of mobile telecommunications facilities within school grounds or TAFE campuses."

While the Department cannot state a specific separation distance between a proposed mobile telecommunications facility and a school or TAFE campus, the Department has a preference for a distance of at least 500 metres from the boundary of the property.

CTHS Moondance Ball








Literary Festival




UTS Law Discovery Day
