Year 7 Camp

The playground was abuzz with nervous and excited bodies on Wednesday when the parents of our newest students arrived on mass to drop off their precious children. With a kiss and for some a tear, 290 students assembled with eighteen brave staff and twenty Peer Support Leaders ready to depart for camp. Pleasingly, the buses arrived on time and everyone departed for Narrabeen Academy of Sport.

Activities on the camp seek to test comfort zones, develop teamwork, build leadership and develop friendships. It also provides an excellent opportunity for students to get to know staff and their Peer Support

Leaders. Congratulations to the Year 7 students who participated eagerly, were very cooperative and well behaved throughout the three days.

Thank yous also need to be extended to the Peer Support Leaders, who graciously gave up valuable learning time to assist, as well as to staff who volunteered to attend and finally, to Mr Hind and Mrs Howard for organising another truly successful camp.

Cross Country

Study Skills and Sleep Seminar

Parents of Year 12 attended a very informative Study Skills Seminar on Thursday evening, focussing on how they can best assist their child leading into the HSC. The enthusiastic presenters from Elevate Education discussed a diverse range of topics including goal setting, motivation, organisation, time management and how best to relieve stress during examination periods. This year we again had an additional hour devoted to effective sleep. This session provided scientific evidence and practical tips on how best to perform during what is a stressful time for many students. Thank you to Mrs Sorensen for organising this event. The feedback from students, as always, was that this was an invaluable part of their HSC preparation.

Year 12 Parent/Teacher Interviews

The first Parent/Teacher Interviews of the year occurred on Tuesday evening in the MPC. This gave parents of Year 12 students the opportunity to discuss the progress with their child's teachers. A key factor for success is the interest and value our community places on the development and learning of their children and this was evident by the sheer number of parents in attendance. This is a critical time for Year 12 students as they prepare for the upcoming AP3 exams and ultimately, the HSC and beyond. Many key discussions revolved around strategies and tips to optimise performance and ideas to encourage and motivate students for the challenges which lie ahead in the coming year.

Year 6 into 7 Information Night

Tuesday 28 February is the annual CTHS Year 6 into 7 Information Night, which will run from 6.00pm until 8.00pm. The evening will display why CTHS is a great place to learn. There will be the opportunity to hear from current Year 7 students, who will relay their experiences thus far. Mr Johnson (Principal), Mrs Howard (Stage 4 Head Teacher) and Mrs Bevan (Deputy Principal) will also deliver key information to prospective new students and their families. The CTHS Information Night allows parents and students from Year 6, who live in the local area, the opportunity to have a guided tour of the school facilities and to hear from staff about the opportunity to speak with staff from all Key Learning Areas.

Overall, the work of the actors and the fantastic Q and A session with the actors after the show provided our drama students with a very rich experience that is sure to inform their classroom activities.



Correct Procedure When Approaching Pedestrian Crossings

As you approach a pedestrian crossing or children's crossing where a School Crossing Supervisor is displaying a 'STOP Children Crossing' sign, you must **slow down and stop**. You may proceed when the School Crossing Supervisor no longer displays the sign in your direction or has indicated it is safe for you to proceed.



Stop signs may be placed at an intersection immediately after a pedestrian crossing. You must stop at the stop sign even if you have already stopped at the pedestrian crossing.

Please Note: If the road beyond a children's crossing or pedestrian crossing is blocked, you **MUST NOT** drive onto the crossing.



PROCEDURE FOR EARLY LEAVERS
