## **DEPUTY PRINCIPAL'S REPORT**



#### Year 11 Camp

The Year 11 camp is often remembered with fondness as one of the students' best school experiences. We will depart for Jindabyne on Monday morning, 27 March and students must be at school by **5.15am**. There are a range of outdoor activities for students to participate in whilst at camp, with the highlights likely to be the Mt Kosciuszko walk and the picturesque cook-out on the top of the hill overlooking the campsite. Compulsory Crossroads modules will also be completed by students during the week. Those students who are not attending camp are expected to attend school for the week and will complete an alternate program. It is anticipated buses will return on Friday 31 March, by **approximately 6pm** at the earliest. Parents are asked **NOT** to **PARK IN THE BUS BAY** when dropping off or collecting their children.

#### **Examination Preparation and Tips**

As we progress through the AP3 Examination period and quickly move towards the AP1 Examination period, a few tips and tricks may be handy for both parents and students. I have put together a few ideas which may be helpful:

- 1. Preparation and Planning is Essential: Whereas cramming can be of some use if students have not prepared for the examinations, preparation and planning is essential. Study sessions should be planned and include breaks to relax.
- 2. Organisation: Ensure all necessary exam equipment is in a kit. Having an exam kit means one less thing for students to think about.
- 3. Avoid Stress: Stress is contagious, therefore, try and surround yourself with positive people rather than those who may add to your stress levels. Keep in mind, group study sessions may not be a helpful environment. Parents should also try their best to keep calm and be a calming influence.
- 4. Eat Properly: Nutrition is a key part of overall wellbeing and health. This includes having a proper breakfast before an exam. Proper nutrition is a proven factor linked to academic performance. Caffeine is a detractor from performance and should be avoided, especially in energy drinks, as the added sugar is certainly not good for anyone.
- 5. Exercise: This is another factor linked to performance. Exercise is proven to reduce stress and anxiety. It will also supply oxygen, antioxidants and glucose to the brain, allowing greater clarity of thought.
- 6. SLEEP WELL: Sleep deprivation is proven to reduce brain function. Enough said.
- 7. Keep Everything in Perspective: Whilst the HSC is important to you and families alike, there is always an alternative way to achieve one's goals.

A number of our staff are attending training sessions and our administration staff are currently undertaking a range of tasks in readiness for the changeover date. 
#### **EpiPen Recall**

Please be aware that Mylan is recalling all EpiPen Adrenaline Auto-Injectors with an expiry date of April 2017. These pens are part of the following batch numbers 5FA665, 5FA6651, 5FA6652, 5FA6653. The batch number can be found above the expiry date on the EpiPen itself. The school has identified a number of students whose EpiPen is affected by this recall, and asks for all parents of students carrying autoinjectors to check this information and replace them if necessary.

From the Government TGA website: "If your EpiPen is from batch 5FA665, 5FA6651, 5FA6652 or 5FA6653 (all of which expire in April 2017), return it to a pharmacy. The pharmacist will replace the EpiPen from an affected batch with an EpiPen from a different, unaffected batch free of charge".

This is a timely moment to remind parents that all students with anaphylaxis should always carry an EpiPen with them, with the student's ASCIA Personal Management Plan wrapped around it. A copy of the ASCIA plan must also be given to the school.
