Bullying 'No Way' Assembly

The theme for this week's Assembly was Anti-Bullying. This is a subject almost everyone is aware of, yet it remains an issue for many. The nature of bullying has changed in recent years, with the advent of social media, which potentially takes away any respite for the victim. It is a repeated and deliberate behaviour.

Bullying remains a complex and critical issue within schools, with one in four students reporting they are being bullied on a regular basis. Recent research from Mission Australia cites the top three reasons for unfair treatment or discrimination as being based on gender, race/cultural background or age. One in two young people have witnessed someone being unfairly treated or discriminated against.

This is not acceptable and should not be tolerated by anyone! The impact of bullying can last a lifetime both physically and mentally. The aim of the Assembly was to highlight this to students and send a very clear message that CTHS is not a place where this type of behaviour is accepted. Students are encouraged to talk to someone they trust if they feel they are being bullied. Do not suffer in silence

Everyone has the right to feel safe and be treated with respect.

Athletics Carnival

After an earlier 'false start' to the Athletics Carnival in Term 1, we finally managed to snag two sunny (albeit cold) days at Greenway Oval on Wednesday and Thursday of this week, with an overall attendance of 1,412. The numbers were down on last year, which is a little disappointing. It is important to note, attendance at these events is compulsory! Nevertheless, those students present were able to enjoy the day either as a competitor or spectator.

Thanks goes to the staff who organised the Carnival, the student volunteers and the Sports Executive, whose boundless enthusiasm made for an enjoyable and memorable day.

Year 8 and 11 Parent/Teacher Night

Building Project Update

The building project continues to progress towards the first major milestone, the pouring of the ground floor slab. Currently, the necessary preparations for the plumbing and formwork are being completed. Commencing 7 June 2017, traffic control management will be employed on Tuesdays and Wednesdays between the hours of 6.30am and 12.00pm as the cement trucks enter and exit the site from Purchase Road. This will cause traffic delays on Purchase Road and we apologise for any inconvenience caused. It is anticipated the ground floor slab will be completed by Thursday 22 June 2017. 












Harmony Day Ceremony at Parliament House


Parliament of NSW 2017, Secondary Schools' Student Leadership Program






Furthermore, the feedback and guidance we were given by the experienced drama teachers on site was invaluable to our creative process and really helped us all in the development of our pieces.

CANTERBURY JACKETS EXCHANGES AND ENQUIRIES

As the cooler weather approaches, parents wishing to order Canterbury Jackets can purchase them online via the Cherrybrook Technology High School website, http://cths.nsw.edu.au/ Information>Uniforms and Backpacks. Please be aware, many parents have expressed frustration with enquires going unanswered. However, CTHS has no contact with Canterbury itself.

All enquiries must be made **directly** with Canterbury, by clicking on *Make Enquiry* under the *Add to Cart* button on the ordering screen.

Prior to ordering, it is essential students visit Mrs Bevan's office to **try on sample jackets** to ascertain their correct size. If you purchase the wrong size, you will need to return it via post to Canterbury and wait for a replacement to arrive, which can take up to three weeks or more.

The following information was sent to us from Canterbury regarding Exchanges:

"People are more than welcome to exchange jackets with us. They have to send us the jackets with a **returned post-paid bag** with their address on it so we can send it back to them. The invoice needs to be in the bag as we need it for our paperwork. The jackets must have the tags still on them and in an unworn condition."
