DEPUTY PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Mental Health Conference 2017

I was very fortunate to be able to attend the Propsych Conference for two days at the end of May. As always, a wide variety of quality speakers presented talks on issues being faced by adolescents. These included, non-suicidal self-injury, the issue of screen addiction, why pornography is an issue for schools and school prevention programs for eating disorders. We were presented with some confronting statistics regarding the mental health of our young people. Almost one in seven young people (aged 4 to 17) were assessed as having a mental disorder last year. Less than half of people living with mental health issues access treatment each year, with untreated mental illness incurring major personal suffering and economic costs.

Evidence suggests that three in four adult mental health conditions emerge by the age of 24 and half by the age of 14. Mental health disorders are an important factor in limiting economic and social participation and it has been argued that improving mental health can reduce unemployment and welfare dependency.

I have shared many of the papers obtained at the Conference with the Welfare team. We will be organising a Stress, Anxiety and Coping session for all Year 11 students in the near future, to help them become more aware of how to maintain balance in their life and study. This session will focus on some basic cognitive and relaxation strategies which can be implemented.

New School Leaders Selection Underway

On Tuesday afternoon the first stage of the Senior School Leaders' Selection began with a team of students, parents and staff reading and discussing a large number of quality resumés in an effort to select the eighteen students who will move on to the final stage of the selection process. This will involve giving a prepared speech and answering a range of unseen questions.

My thanks are extended to Mrs Helen Wrench from the P&C, our past school captain Seyon Sanchayan as the Alumni representative and our current School Leaders, who provided thoughtful and insightful views during the course of the selection process, which really added to the occasion.

Year 12 High Achievers' Morning Tea

On Thursday, Year 12 High Achievers assembled for a morning tea with the Senior Executive, Year Advisers and Stage Head Teacher, in recognition and celebration of their outstanding results from the AP3 examinations. It was a chance to chat and reflect on the strategies and hard work completed by these students thus far and an opportunity to discover their dreams and aspirations.


Parent/Teacher Nights

On Thursdays (sport days) all students in Years 9-11 must have their early leave notes signed by a member of the PE staff before presenting to the office.



University of Sydney Talented Student Program Showcase - Life or Death

I recently had the pleasure of attending the University of Sydney Talented Student Program Showcase to see presentations by Dominik Strbik and other selected University of Sydney first year Science students.

The Talented Student Program is an invitation-only program for Sydney University Science students and includes a group project in the first year of study, which is showcased and assessed at the annual TSP Showcase event. Dominik, who graduated from CTHS in 2016, was selected to participate in the Program as a result of his outstanding ATAR.

This year's Showcase focused on *Life or Death* and fifteen research groups were given a topic at the beginning of the semester to investigate. The topics were diverse and required a range of investigative techniques from hands-on laboratory research (eg assessing the number of organisms exhibiting fluorescence) to literature reviews and analysis of data. *Euthanasia*, the research topic investigated by Dominik and his group, involved interviews and data analysis.

The students were extremely articulate and the depth of knowledge on their research topics was impressive. I am honoured Dominik invited me to attend this evening and delighted to see him challenging himself in the field of Science research.

National Gonski Week - Save Gonski

The Australian Education Union and the New South Wales Teachers Federation, acting as advocates for public education, are asking teachers and community members to take part in the current schools funding debate.

The Gonski Review was the most comprehensive investigation of the way our schools are funded in almost 40 years.

Headed by respected businessperson David Gonski, it found that too many children were being denied the education they needed due to a lack of resources.



The idea was to create a system where a student's success at school would be determined by their ability, application and willingness to work hard rather than where they lived, what their family background was or whether they were indigenous or had a disability.

Legislation to undo the National Education Reform Agreement (a.k.a. the Gonski agreement) is currently before Federal Parliament, and is expected to reach the senate sometime in the next couple of weeks.

If these changes pass through the senate, then NSW public schools will lose \$846 million in needs-based funding in 2018/19, and billions more over the next decade.

The following table highlights the effect repealing the legislation could have on Cherrybrook Technology High. This estimate was calculated using figures from the NSW Department of Education:

The Gonski campaign is asking community members to join the campaign by urgently contacting local federal members of parliament and voicing their concerns about the proposed changes.







Morrisby Career Assessment Program for CTHS Students

In order to support students in their important career decisions, Cherrybrook Technology High School has chosen to implement a comprehensive career assessment program called The Morrisby Report. The Report focuses on career interests, abilities and some aspects of personality.

The intention is to provide an objective assessment of your son/daughter's strengths (to be viewed alongside their attainment at school). The results should prove helpful in understanding the direction of your son/daughter's talents and in making subject, course and eventually, career decisions. The Morrisby Report is well established, well researched and is used by many schools in NSW, Victoria and the UK. We are pleased to be able to offer it to our students.

The program involves three stages:

- A career interest questionnaire which asks students about their work preferences, the subjects they are studying plus their attitudes to further study. This will be completed prior to the testing day and students will be given a copy when they pay at the Student Window.
- A test during school time (approximately 3.5 hours with a ten minute break) which
 involves a series of 12 paper and pencil tests designed to build up a picture of individual
 strengths and abilities. The tests are not like an examination and do not require any special
 preparation. This will take place on Monday 31 July from 9:30am 2pm in the MPC.
- 3. Following the testing program, a 20 page personal report describing the student's results will be compiled and given to students at the Student & Parent Information Evening. This evening provides the opportunity to hear more about the Morrisby Report and reflect upon any implications for your son/daughter's decision making. This will take place on Tuesday 22 August from 7pm-8pm in C2.1. A personal website login is provided to enable students to further research the 12 career suggestions made in their report. Students should visit the Career Analysts website (www.careeranalysts.com.au) before the test to familiarise themselves with the style of the tests.

This program is being offered to students at a highly competitive cost of \$100. Your son/daughter's Morrisby Report will be a valuable resource in careers interviews and careers decision making over the HSC years. 


