High Achievers' Presentation Ceremony

One of the most prestigious events on the Cherrybrook Technology High School calendar is the High Achievers' Presentation Ceremony, which celebrates the HSC achievements of the previous year's Year 12 cohort. 146 students from the class of 2017 were recognised on NESA's Honour Roll for achieving a Band 6 in a course of study. Each of these students and their parents, will attend this special Awards Ceremony at the school on Friday 16 February to celebrate their success.

P&C General Meeting

Our first P&C meeting for 2018 was held on Tuesday 6 February. It was refreshing to see a large turnout of parents, many of whom were new Year 7 parents to the school. Our Principal, Mr Johnson, gave a presentation on the 2017 HSC results and trends we have seen at CTHS over the past few years. This week we conducted an emergency evacuation drill for all students and staff, which ran smoothly with all students making their way to the John Purchase PS oval in a quick and orderly fashion. A debriefing with staff will occur over the coming days to ascertain where adjustments to the plan are necessary. A big thank you to everyone involved for their patience and professional approach to the drill and to Mrs Gatt for her thorough planning and organisation of the WH&S areas.



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

General Permission to Publish

Dear Parents/Caregivers

The school is currently updating its records with regard to general publishing. Hopefully your holidays have energised and excited, relaxed and refreshed you leaving marvellous memories of friends and families, leisure and pleasure.



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NSW School Vaccination Program Vaccination Clinic Visits 2018

Each year NSW Health works in partnership with schools to offer the vaccines recommended by the National Health and Medical Research Council (NHMRC) for adolescents, as part of the school vaccination program.

In 2018 the following vaccines will be offered:

Year	Vaccine	Number of doses
Year 7	Human papillomavirus (HPV) vaccine	Two doses at least six months apart
	Diphtheria-Tetanus-Pertussis (whooping cough) vaccine	Single dose
Years 10 & 11	Meningococcal ACWY vaccine	Single dose

Parent Information Kits for parents/guardians, which include an information sheet, consent form and privacy statement, will be sent home to parents/guardians via your child. To consent to the vaccination of your child, parents/guardians are advised to:

- Read all the information provided
- Complete the consent form, including signing your name next to the vaccine/s you would like your child to receive
- Return the completed consent form to the school
- Ensure your child eats breakfast on the day of the school vaccination clinic.

Please note students who commence HPV vaccination in school clinics in Year 7 but do not complete the course during the school year, may be offered catch-up doses at school in Year 8. Students who receive HPV doses at their GP will be advised to complete the course with their GP.

Parents/guardians who wish to withdraw their consent for any reason may do so by writing to the school Principal or phoning the school. The Procedure for Withdrawal of Consent is available on the NSW Health website at www.health.nsw.gov.au/immunisation.

To improve vaccination completion, students will be opportunistically offered any missed doses throughout the year where possible.

A Record of Vaccination will be provided to each student vaccinated at each clinic, either as a physical card or a text message sent to the mobile number recorded on the consent form (within one business day). Parents/guardians should ensure this record is kept for future reference and should not assume their child has been vaccinated if they do not receive this Record of Vaccination.



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



PROCEDURE FOR SICK STUDENTS

Students who are sick during class should see a teacher for written permission to go to sick bay. They must present themselves promptly to the **front office** and politely follow instructions from the office staff, who will then contact a parent/guardian when necessary. Sick bay is used for a short time only. Students should not call their parents in the first instance. **Please be advised the school does not supply any medication, including pain killers, medicated creams, eye drops etc.**

PROCEDURE FOR EARLY LEAVERS

If a student needs to leave school early, they **must** provide a note from their parent/guardian giving reasons for their partial absence. **The student must hand the note in at the student window before 8.30am** where they will be issued with a leave pass. They can then present this pass to their teacher and leave school at the appropriate time.

On Thursdays (sport days) all students in Years 9-11 must have their early leave notes signed by a member of the PE staff before presenting to the office.
