### **AP3 Examinations Continue**

As we progress through the AP3 Examination period and quickly move towards the AP1 Examination period, I have put together a few tips and tricks which may be handy for parents:

- · First and foremost, support and encourage your child, keep any doubts you have to yourself
- Celebrate success and don't dwell or get bogged down by mistakes. Mistakes are an opportunity to grow and learn
- Understand this is a stressful time, even if your child is not showing it. A lot of the fear comes from your child's desire to not let you down
- When under pressure people become supersensitive and normally react to those closest to them. Don't overreact or take this
  as a personal attack
- Be realistic in your expectations, 99+ ATARs are extraordinarily hard to achieve!
- If your child is experiencing difficulties, they should seek help; the Counsellors, Year Advisers, Stage Head Teacher and DPs can all be of assistance
- A healthy balance between work and leisure is critical; organise and plan for all activities on a weekly basis
- Discuss and try to take an interest in what your child is doing; some will let you in, some won't, be careful there is a fine line between taking an interest and interfering
- Remember they will need your love and support through this entire HSC year.

The Morrisby test is a psychometric test which uses a range of assessments, as well as a questionnaire, to inform people on their strengths and interests, motivations, skills, personality and desires. The se results are collated into an individualised report for each student, which gives recommendations for future education and career choices









which match people's abilities and interests. For many students it helps to confirm their future vocation interests and for others, who were unsure of which direction to follow, it gives them some starting points to consider. ### **Building Project Update**


Only two weeks to go! The final touches are now underway with classroom furniture and storage arriving on site this week. Electricians are completing the installation of internal and external wireless access points and the first phase of landscaping has commenced despite the poor weather conditions. Internal doors have now been installed and we will shortly see the arrival of the 86" Interactive Touch Panels which will be mounted in each of the 24 classroom spaces. Students will be pleased to learn a water cooler / bottle filling station, which was donated by the 2016 Year 12 Cohort, has been installed on the new building.

Next week the furniture will be placed in each of the rooms, three sets of stairs leading to the first floor, as well as safety rails, will be completed and the cleaning prior to final inspections will commence.
























### PROCEDURE FOR EARLY LEAVERS

If a student needs to leave school early, they *must* provide a note from their parent/guardian giving reasons for their partial absence. The student must hand the note into the student window before **8.30am** where they will be issued with a leave pass. They can then present this pass to their teacher and leave school at the appropriate time.

On Thursdays (sport days) all students in Years 9-11 must have their early leave notes signed by a member of the PE staff before presenting to the office.

### PROCEDURE FOR SICK STUDENTS

Students who are sick during class should see a teacher for written permission to go to sick bay. They must present themselves promptly to the **front office** and politely follow instructions from the office staff, who will then contact a parent/guardian when necessary. Sick bay is used for a short time only. Students should not call their parents in the first instance. *Please be advised the school does not supply any medication, including pain killers, medicated creams, eye drops etc.*
