DEPUTY PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Term 2

Welcome back to Term 2 and as you are probably already aware, Term 2 is traditionally a very busy time of year at CTHS. Please take time to familiarise yourself with the calendar of events scheduled for this term. This is particularly important regarding Parent/Teacher Interviews, which require bookings ahead of time to enable you to see your child's teachers. We hope you enjoyed a very relaxing break and are ready to jump back into another term here at Cherrybrook.

School Uniform

As the weather cools down, we need to remind the student body about wearing the correct winter school uniform for the next two terms. Junior boys please remember you are now required to wear your tie every day. There are limited sizes of the Canterbury jackets still available from the front office. However, a full size range

of these jackets will be available from Lowes at Castle Towers in the near future. The School Uniform Code specifies the types of acceptable jackets/jumpers for school wear, which does **NOT** include jackets or jumpers with hoods! The wearing of a 'hoodie' is likely to result in time spent in detention. If you need to wear an item of clothing which is not school uniform, please see a Deputy before school, with a signed parental note, explaining why you are out of uniform.

Please be aware we will be conducting a uniform blitz in the near future. Students who are out of uniform without permission will be issued a lunchtime detention.

Stage 5, Years 9 and 10 Parent/Teacher Interviews

A reminder to parents the first of our Parent/Teacher Interviews for Term 2 is scheduled for Tuesday 8 May, Week 2. If you have a child in Years 9 or 10, you can access the Parent Portal and book a time to meet your child's teacher to discuss their progress. This booking window will close Sunday evening, 6 May.

Year 11 Exams

The first formal examination period for our new senior students commenced this week. Students are reminded to see Miss Adamou if they experience Misadventure or Illness, as per their student handbooks. These exams present the first opportunity for staff, students and parents to obtain real feedback on examinations and assessments in the senior school and are vitally important for preparation towards the HSC. Examinations will run until 18 May.

NAPLAN

The National Assessment Program - Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) assesses literacy and numeracy skills. NAPLAN for Years 7 and 9 will occur in Week 3 from Tuesday 15 until Thursday 17 May. NAPLAN will be in the written format as CTHS has not elected to complete the test online at this stage. Year 9 will complete the tests in the morning and Year 7 will complete their tests in the afternoon. Students who miss a test will be able to catch up on Friday 18 May. Individual students are not permitted to sit tests after Friday 18 May.

Athletics Carnival

Our annual Athletics Carnival was held during the last week of Term 1, on 11 and 12 April. It was an outstanding day with record numbers of students participating in the many events offered on the day. Congratulations to the PE staff for their organisation of this event.

Head Teacher Stage 5 / Head Teacher Administration

Stage 5 Agriculture Students' Success at the Royal Easter Show

Students of Stage 5 Agriculture prepared exhibits for this year's Royal Easter Show and had some success.

CTHS entered a 'light' and 'dark' liquid honey in the School's section and we won two Seconds! Stage 5 Agriculture extracted honey from the school hives last year and prepared it for the show this year. Honey is judged on colour, flavour, density and aroma and we scored 90+% for both honeys. The mix of local bush and garden flowers around the school make for a very good honey.











Meat Bird Competition

Students raised, selected and prepared meat chickens for live and carcass judging. They also developed a presentation to document how the birds were cared for, raised and grew over the six weeks from hatching to competition. Over 100 schools from across NSW entered, making this is a difficult competition to succeed in and we unfortunately did not figure in the medals this year.

Stage 5 Agriculture students learnt a lot about putting chicken meat on the table and CTHS will certainly enter this competition next year striving to win a ribbon.

Building Project

At 8am the next morning, we opened the doors for staff and students to finally look around our new educational facility which commenced construction one year and 27 days earlier. Extremely positive feedback was received from all who toured the new building. Included in this week's *Network* are photos of the first classes taking place.

During the holidays, the remainder of the J and K Block demountables were removed from our site, which has now cleared the way for Milestone 2 to commence. Milestone 2 incorporates the new sports court (including the cover funded by the CTHS P&C) and landscaping. The G Block Science refurb has also commenced with the demolition of the old Visual Arts and Multimedia spaces.

It is expected the entire project will be completed by mid to late August 2018, at which time we will have an official opening of the new and upgraded education facilities.

ANZAC Day

The CTHS ANZAC Day ceremonies were held at the end of Term 1, on Tuesday 10 April. Adam Bourne and Esther Whitehead spoke about the meaning and significance of ANZAC Day and the importance of taking time to remember those who fought for our country over many years and on various battle fronts. The audience was witness to a thought-provoking drama piece performed by the Stage 5 Drama class and accompanied by Isaak Koorey on the guitar singing 'The Green Fields of France'.

Of course, this year marks the 100 Year Anniversary of significant battles involving Australians on the Western Front in France and Belgium. In the Battle of Fromelles and the Battle of Pozieres, the Australian Infantry Force lost over 7,000 men, with a casualty count close to 30,000. Later this year we will commemorate the Armistice, on 11 November at 11am, which ended the fighting in Europe with a ceremony befitting the occasion. A big thank you must go to Mr Hartman for coordinating the ceremonies, to Ms Cannon and her Stage 5 Drama class and to Isaak Koorey for his stunning performance.

Isaak Koorey is also to be congratulated for his commitment and involvement in ANZAC Day activities outside of school. This year he played the Last Post and Reveille at no less than five ANZAC Day ceremonies including, The Hills District RSL Sub-branch held at the Galston Cenotaph, BUPA Dural Nursing Home, Rowland Village Aged Care Centre and the Glenorie and Galston RSL Commemoration Services.

Isaak's younger brother, Saxon, also deserves congratulations for his involvement in ANZAC Day activities as a member of the Millennium Marching Band, which played in the official March in Sydney.

Lady Elliot Island Geography Field Trip 2018

During the first week of the school holidays, eleven students from our Year 12 Geography class headed off to Lady Elliot Island for a long awaited four-day field trip. The site provides a great opportunity to undertake our compulsory field work looking at two case studies within the Year 12 Syllabus, The Great Barrier Reef as an Ecosystem at Risk and the Lady Elliot Island Eco Resort as a case study of a local tourism enterprise. We were blessed with outstanding weather whilst we were there. For the first two days there was not a breath of wind, which made the water conditions outstanding for snorkelling, with a mirror like glassy surface and 30 metres visibility under the water. It was during our Snorkel Safari on the second day that we encountered and swam with a dolphin which had strayed from its nearby pod, a magical experience for all involved!

Whilst we missed out on seeing the turtle hatchlings and mantas, we did swim with a number of juvenile and adult turtles, eagle rays, large grey tawny nurse sharks and black and white tipped reef sharks. We also experienced the wonders of the lagoon at low tide where we spotted many creatures including sea stars, sea cucumbers and an epaulette reef shark which can use its fins to walk across the reef flat! The staff on the island always look after us well and students learnt a great deal from the Manager of the resort who took us on a behind-the-scenes tour of the whole operation. As a group, students banded together well and enjoyed their time on what is a magnificent island! Whether it was a sunrise snorkel or a kayak across the lagoon they never complained and were keen to make the most of their time on the island.

Thank you to Mr Caccamo, Ms Kerr and all students who attended the trip for, what I hope was, a wonderful learning experience and something which will live on in your memory for years to come. I know leaving the island was tinged with some sadness!





New School Zone Road Rules

To keep the School Zone safer for all pedestrians and drivers there are seven new traffic offences with new fines. None of the seven offences attract demerit points when committed elsewhere on the road. However, they now each come with two points in a **school zone**.

The changes are:

- Stopping in intersection Under the changes if a driver commits this offence in a school zone they will
 receive a penalty of \$439 and two demerit points
- Stop within 20m of intersection (traffic lights) Under the changes if a driver commits this offence in a school zone they will receive a penalty of \$439 and two demerit points
- Stop within 10m of intersection (no traffic lights) Under the changes if a driver commits this offence in a school zone they will receive a penalty of \$439 and two demerit points
- Stop near bicycle crossing lights Under the changes if a driver commits this offence in a school zone
 they will receive a penalty of \$439 and two demerit points
- Obstruct access to ramp/path/passageway Under the changes if a driver commits this offence in a school zone they will receive a penalty of \$330 and two demerit points
- Not parallel park in the direction of travel Under the changes if a driver commits this offence in a school zone they will receive a \$330 fine and two demerit points
- Parallel park close to dividing line Under the changes if a driver commits this offence in a school zone they will receive a \$330 fine and two demerit points.

Student Attendance in Government Schools

Dear Parents / Guardians

When your child is away from school it is important parents comply with the guidelines set out in the Student Attendance Policy, the Student Attendance in Government Schools Procedures, as well as established School Procedures.

Please note the following requirements:

1. ABSENCE FROM SCHOOL

Parents are required to provide an explanation of absence to the school **within seven days** from the first day of any period of absence.

This explanation can take place in the form of an email, text message or written note.

2. TRAVEL DURING THE SCHOOL TERM

Parents will be required to complete an *Application for Extended Leave - Travel* form and submit it to the Principal for his / her consideration. If the Principal accepts the reason for travel, the absence will be marked as 'Leave' and a *Certificate of Extended Leave - Travel* will be issued.

Before applying for *Extended Leave - Travel*, **it is the responsibility of students** to discuss any scheduled assessment tasks with the Head Teacher of each of their subjects and check the school calendar for timetabled activities.

This Application for Extended Leave - Travel form must be submitted to the student window, two weeks prior to the date of departure.

If travel leave is taken without prior knowledge of the Principal, the leave will be marked as **UNEXPLAINED - UNJUSTIFIED**.

The Application for Extended Leave - Travel form can be downloaded from the Parent Portal, located under 'School Documents'.

Please note: School Policy requires you to provide the completed *Application for Extended Leave - Travel* form, along with all necessary documentation, for **more than three days** absence from school.

3. MISSED WORK, ASSESSMENT TASKS AND MANDATORY PROGRAMS

It is the **student**'s **responsibility** to find out and catch up on missed work from their classroom teacher or the Faculty Head Teacher.

Students who seek permission for leave must take into consideration the timetabling of *formal* assessment tasks and **mandatory programs** such as Crossroads. A student missing a formal assessment task can be given a zero (0) result if they fail to complete the tasks at the scheduled time. Application for leave during this time *may not* be approved.

Students taking leave during periods of **formal assessment tasks** and **mandatory programs** may be recorded as **EXPLAINED** - **UNJUSTIFIED**.



Optimising STEM Industry School Partnerships From Australia's Chief Scientist

Australia's Chief Scientist, Dr Alan Finkel AO, has prepared a report on the role of STEM in schools, focussing on how STEM is and should be taught and how it will relate to the jobs of the future.

"Employers with the vision to invest in the future have the insight to look for T-shaped individuals, those who have deep specialty skills (the vertical pole of the T) and broad enterprise skills (the horizontal bar of the T). Take away the horizontal bar and you are left with an 'I' - lots of discipline knowledge, but lacking the collaborative skills to contribute that knowledge effectively. Take away the vertical pole and you are left with a dash - possibly smart, but always rushing off for the answers instead of being able to contribute to the discussion."



PROCEDURE FOR SICK STUDENTS

Students who are sick during class should see a teacher for written permission to go to sick bay. They must present themselves promptly to the **front office** and politely follow instructions from the office staff, who will then contact a parent/guardian when necessary. Sick bay is used for a short time only. Students should not call their parents in the first instance. *Please be advised the school does not supply any medication, including pain killers, medicated creams, eye drops etc.*



If a student needs to leave school early, they *must* provide a note from their parent/guardian giving reasons for their partial absence. The student must hand the note into the student window before 8.30am where they will be issued with a leave pass. They can then present this pass to their teacher and leave school at the appropriate time.

On Thursdays (sport days) all students in Years 9-11 must have their early leave notes signed by a member of the PE staff before presenting to the office.
