Year 8 Life Saving

Year 8 Lifesaving started last week and finished on Friday on what was a cracking week of fine spring weather! A total of 314 Year 8 students, seventeen teachers and 54 Year 9 and 10 student instructors, headed off to three pools over the three-day program, which aimed to complete an extremely important part of the PDHPE syllabus. There were six courses, each suited to ability levels, which were challenging and enjoyable. All courses included a first aid theory component, as well as resuscitation training and assessment. A big thanks to Mr Pedley-Smith, Mrs Flowers and Ms Eathorne for organising the event and also to the Year 9 and 10 instructors (who Ms Flowers described as the most outstanding instructors ever!) for volunteering their time to help.

Year 11 into 12 Information Night

On Tuesday evening, Year 11 students and their families attended the Year 11 into 12 Information Night. Preliminary HSC reports were handed out to those in attendance. Reports for students who were absent on the evening, have been posted home.

The Principal, Deputies and Mr Lamont addressed the audience on a variety of important topics, including assessment procedures, signing-on, study leave passes and what to expect in Year 12 in general.

Swimming Carnival

On Wednesday this week we held our annual School Swimming Carnival. This year the carnival was held at an outdoor venue, Waves at Baulkham Hills. The beautiful sunny weather ensured a good attendance with many students keen to get into the water to cool off. Year 11/12 students got into the spirit of the day with many dressed in appropriate costumes to fit the *God and Goddess* theme. With the final result of the Carnival not known until the Year 7 Swimming Carnival early next year, it was pleasing to see some students participating. Thank you to the PE staff, particularly Ms Llamas and Mr O'Connor, for organising the event and to the huge number of student volunteers whose assistance is essential for the smooth running of the day.

What was obvious on the day was the amount of students who chose not to swim at all. Given Sydney's warm climate and proximity to beaches it perplexes me this was the case. I am not sure if it is apathy or a lack of swimming ability driving this decision. Regardless, as a keen swimmer and visitor of the beach myself, it is a sad reflection on our society if this trend continues. We will certainly encourage more student participation in any of our major Carnivals in the future.

Remembrance Day

Remembrance Day has a special significance in 2018. Sunday 11 November 2018 marks the 100th Anniversary of the Armistice, which ended the First World War (1914-1918). One hundred years ago, on 11 November 1918, the guns of the Western Front fell silent after four years of continuous warfare. With their armies retreating and close to collapse, German leaders signed an Armistice, bringing to an end the First World War. In the four years of the war, more than 330,000 Australians served overseas and more than 60,000 of them died.

Each year on this day, Australians observe one minute's silence at 11.00am, in memory of those who died or suffered in all wars and armed conflicts. At CTHS, our Remembrance Day Commemoration will take place next Friday, 9 November, with a whole school assembly. Mr Hartman and his team have been working on a ceremony befitting the occasion.

GPs in Schools

On Tuesday 29 October, Year 11 attended the *GPs in Schools Workshop* organised by the Sydney North Primary Health Network, which is funded and guided by the Australian Department of Health. The students met in small groups with registered General Practitioners and Nurses to build confidence and health literacy in areas such as access to free healthcare, specific youth health issues, confidentiality, Medicare, bulk billing and healthcare rights. Students were able to discuss access to the Australian healthcare system, physical and mental health and alcohol and other drug awareness.

The feedback from students and the GPs was extremely positive. This was a great experience for our senior students and we hope that it empowers them to seek medical advice when needed.


Year 11 Drama Retrospective 2018




