#### International Women's Day Assembly

On Tuesday of this week students attended a terrific Assembly with the focus being International Women's Day. The Social Justice Team, led by Ms Campbell and Ms Corbett, organised a jam-packed agenda, which included film, music and a most impressive guest speaker, Ms Aminata Conteh-Biger.

Aminata spoke of her time growing up in Sierra Leone, Western Africa and how a very fine childhood was taken from her when her country was torn apart by war and how she was forced to accompany armed rebels who used her as a human shield and sex slave. Animata, after a string of extraordinarily difficult and dangerous events, arrived in Australia as a 20 year-old refugee. She has since completed school, married, had two children and gone on to found a charity, entitled The Aminata Maternal Foundation, which supports women in Sierra Leone during their pregnancy.

To say her story was remarkable is an absolute understatement. Despite what she has been through she remains a most elegant, resilient and positive woman, who serves as a terrific role model. It was very good for our students to hear her story which helped many of them gain a wider perspective on the world and understand the exceptional strength and resilience of the woman telling her story.

#### **ARTEXPRESS Excursion**

On Tuesday 5 March, Year 10 GATs and Year 11 and 12 Visual Art classes visited the ARTEXPRESS Exhibition. This Exhibition included exemplary bodies of work from the 2018 HSC Visual Art students from around the State. The excursion consisted of two displays; one was a display at the Armory, in Homebush, which displayed the best HSC pieces under themes of Culture, Family, Environment and Urban Metropolis. The second was an exhibition at the Art Gallery of NSW in the Domain, which displayed inspiring talent in a variety of media.

The Armory was an amazing experience with displays of mixed media art, all with written blurbs explaining the artists' choices and inspiration for their pieces. Interestingly, all students had varying favourite art works, often preferring pieces which were similar to their art style or what they plan on making for their HSC. The Gallery was separated into different subjects of inspiration, such as Family or Gender etc. At the end of the tour, we could vote for our favourite piece for an opportunity to win a prize. Students had the opportunity to indulge in some overpriced drinks and peaceful seating areas, to discuss our experience in the Gallery.

After a further bus drive through the city, students arrived at the Art Gallery of NSW. We enjoyed lunch in Hyde Park and were flocked by Ibis birds. Once we entered the building, we were overwhelmed with stunning architecture and beautiful artworks, many of an unbelievable scale. We were led to the back of the Gallery to the ARTEXPRESS Exhibition. Upon entrance, we were greeted with the planning and inspiration pages of the artworks inside. These pieces are the ones which have received awards and full or partial scholarships. There were more sculptural and 3D pieces there, as well as multimedia pieces.

Conclusively, this excursion was a great opportunity to view past HSC works and get inspiration for the type of work we could do next year. Both visiting classes were impressed with the quality and creativity of the pieces and were glad to have been given the opportunity to go.

#### PROCEDURES FOR SICK STUDENTS

Students who are sick during class should see a teacher for written permission to go to sick bay. They must present themselves promptly to the **front office** and politely follow instructions from the office staff, who will then contact a parent/guardian when necessary. Sick bay is used for a short time only. Students should not call their parents in the first instance. **Please** be advised the school does not supply any medication, including pain killers, medicated creams, eye drops etc.

#### PROCEDURE FOR EARLY LEAVERS

If a student needs to leave school early, they *must* provide a note from their parent/guardian giving reasons for their partial absence. The student must hand the note in at the student window before 8.30am where they will be issued with a leave pass. They can then present this pass to their teacher and leave school at the appropriate time.

On Thursdays (sport days) all students in Years 9-11 **MUST** have their early leave notes signed by a member of the PE staff before presenting to the office.






