School Leaders' Induction Ceremony

The new School Leaders will be inducted on Friday of next week, 2 August. This newly elected group has been busy meeting and preparing new ideas. The dynamic nature of this group is sure to bring a new flavour to our Student Executive. Staff Development Day

The key component of this assessment task was marketing, where students devised appropriate and effective marketing campaigns to launch their product and make it available to the general public. Students needed to consider their target markets, distribution methods, the pricing of products and advertising and promotion strategies.

Each group had to 'pitch' their campaign to Business Studies teachers, as well as create an appealing and informative display for potential customers (Stage 5 students) who attended on the day.

Overall, The Trade Display Day was a great success, with many students putting in considerable time and effort to develop their marketing campaigns and eye-catching displays. Some certainly appear destined for fulfilling careers in sales and marketing.

Physical Theatre Workshop Attracts Enthusiastic Participants

Kate Sherman is a multi-disciplinary performer, performance maker, choreographer, movement researcher and educator. She is a graduate of NIDA and currently teaches Performance Making there. She has created works throughout Australia as well as studied and created performances in the UK, USA, Hong Kong and Europe. On Monday 22 July, CTHS was privileged to have Kate conduct a full day workshop in Physical Theatre with 28 enthusiastic Drama students across all year groups meeting at 9.30am in C1.1, to develop skills and strategies for devising physically dynamic devised performance.

Here is what Niklas Bommers (Year 7) had to say about the workshop:

The Physical Theatre workshop was a good experience to have under my belt now. To start us off we did a small exercise where you just had to walk around the room and the instructor would say stop and you would just high ten the nearest person. We did other fun things like devise a mindscape where we had to create a story just by body and facial reactions. We also did another activity where we got into groups of four or five and we had to write our names with a chosen part of your body. We then put all of the different devised physical sequences together and came up with a story for the work. My group decided we were in a fictitious war zone and we had to work out a secret code to get the upper hand in the conflict. My favourite part was where one of my friends who also attended the workshop stood on my back and I had to hold him up for a part of the performance.

Vidumini Malalagama and Ean Tzuan Lee from Year 8 commented as follows:

Having the opportunity to attend the workshop hosted by Kate Sherman, specifically targeting the aspects and techniques of physical theatre was a really valuable experience. Kate Sherman is an experienced elite actress who has performed internationally. This opportunity was greatly informative and enjoyable for students attending from all years. We were taught techniques that will improve our improvisational skills and playbuilding. There is no doubt everyone attending benefited from this activity.

Kate Sherman's depth of knowledge and expertise really equipped our Drama students with some exceptionally useful tips for devising group performance and her influence is sure to make itself felt in the work we will see emerging in the drama classroom in the near future.







Attending Upcoming Tertiary Institution Open Days

Register online

Let them know you're coming, that way you will be the first to find out about their workshops and events (so you can get spots first), plus they often offer prizes for registering. Some Open Days require registration to attend.

Get your bearings

Campuses often have thousands of students and can be HUGE, so it pays to familiarise yourself with the layout before you turn up. Download a map or print one off, circle the 'mustsees' and if they offer maps on the day it's a good idea to take one.

How will you get there?

Car parking can be hectic, so plan where you're going to park and how to navigate there. Public transport is usually great around universities, but you may need to check which bus/train will get you there and if they have any special services for the day.

Plan your day

- You should be able to find an online planner or downloadable program, so grab your copy and then decide which events on the day you want to go to. You may need to register for individual events so you don't miss out.
- Pack a pen and notebook or download a note-taking app like Google Keep before you go. You will also need your list of questions (see below for ideas) and if they offer help with applications on the day, take any documents you will need.
- Once you are there participate as much as you can in lectures, workshops, tours, etc. Talk to students and teachers and take brochures so you can remember what they told you.

Questions to ask:

- What kind of jobs do people do after this Degree?
- · Are there any practical components, eg field-trips or internships?
- Is it competitive to get in and are there alternative entry options?
- How easy is it to change if I don't enjoy this course?
- Can I study part-time if my circumstances change?
- Will I be able to work straight away or is there more training?
- What subjects should I study at school?
- Are there any scholarships available?
- Will I get to choose my major after starting the degree?
- Is it possible to study any subjects online?

PROCEDURE FOR EARLY LEAVERS

If a student needs to leave school early, they must provide a note from their parent/guardian giving reasons for their partial absence. The student must hand the note in at the student window before 8.30am where they will be issued with a leave pass. They can then present this pass to their teacher and leave school at the appropriate time.

On Thursdays (sport days) all students in Years 9-11 **MUST** have their early leave notes signed by a member of the PE staff before presenting to the office.

The Safer Drivers Course involves two modules:

Module one: A three-hour facilitated group discussion on how to manage risks on the road. This will involve a maximum of twelve participants and will be delivered by a facilitator.

Module two: A two-hour in-vehicle coaching session to develop low-risk driving strategies. This will involve two participants and a coach. Course cost: \$140

Participants must have completed 50 hours of actual on-road driving experience to be eligible for the course. Credits gained under the 3 for 1 scheme cannot be included.


Participants who complete the course will receive 20 hours credit recorded in their learner driver log book.
