DEPUTY PRINCIPAL'S REPORT



PNG-Aus Partnership Principal's Visit

The second visit from our partnership schools in PNG occurred on Tuesday of this week, albeit with a little less security presence than during the visit from the PNG Prime Minister. The aim of this meeting was mainly a familiarisation visit for the other Principals involved in the program. It provided the group with an opportunity to network over a light lunch with incidental music kindly provided by our Ensemble Group, led by Mr Felton.

With the official proceedings underway and formalities complete, our world-famous mathematics celebrity. Mr Woo, took centre stage. He delivered a mathematics talk and workshop entitled "The Strength of Weak Ties", which had the entire audience enthralled. To finish up the afternoon, the Principals enjoyed a tour of the school

led by our new Student Executive.

Gifted and Talented Students (GATS) Presentations

The Year 7 project in 2019 asked students to consider some of the technologies of the past 100 years which have shaped our world. Students subsequently designed and created an innovative technology which would have a significant impact on our daily lives.

Working in groups, they researched significant technologies to help inform their inventions, then created prototypes and designed a marketing campaign to promote the technology. 7T students presented these technologies and marketing campaign to an audience of their parents and staff.

The Year 8T Special Interest Project was itself an innovation for 2019. Instead of participating in a similarly structured group project as they did in Year 7, 8T students were asked to reflect on their time at school and the learning they have experienced. They individually constructed a representation of the process of their growth and education, both informal education in the T class, and outside of it. 8T presented these projects in a friendly, exhibition-style format to an audience of their parents and staff.

As usual, the quality of the student work was of the highest calibre and presented in many different formats, making decisions about an overall winner very difficult.

AP4 Examinations

Monday was the official start of our trial HSC exams, a critical period for all of Year 12 as it closely mimics the HSC itself. As such, results are an excellent indicator of student achievement and provide the final, formalised opportunity for students to identify areas of improvement for the HSC. As expected, students were nervous, which is a good sign of wanting to achieve. To date, the students have conducted themselves exceptionally well during the first week of exams and despite the apparent pressure, remain steadfastly polite and cooperative. The best way to achieve a result commensurate with your ability is to; study, practise past papers, refine your work and ask your teachers for advice, and in examinations make a genuine attempt to answer each question. Maintaining a balance during this time is also very important. Students will be best prepared with a carefully constructed and realistic study timetable, which also includes some time for exercise and leisure pursuits.

HSC Society and Culture Practical Submission

The first of the HSC Practical works, Society and Culture, were submitted this week to NESA (NSW Education Standards Authority). The submission processes have changed slightly this year, with all work uploaded digitally. This proved no hurdle for these very capable students who were hugely relieved to have completed such a significant portion of their HSC Examination mark. A huge thank you to Mr Hind for all of his work with these students during what is a tremendously stressful time.






