Smart and Skilled Fee-Free Scholarships

Are you going to be enrolling into a Smart and Skilled qualification at Certificate I, Certificate II, Certificate III or Certificate IV level on the NSW Skills List?

The NSW Government's new Smart and Skilled Fee-Free Scholarships mean students can get the skills they need to get the job they want and their course fees will be covered. Young people (aged 15-30) who meet the Smart and Skilled Fee-Free Scholarship criteria are eligible for a Government subsidy which covers their Smart and Skilled course fee. Eligible students can receive a single Fee-Free Scholarship within a financial year and two Fee-Free Scholarships across four financial years.

PROCEDURE FOR EARLY LEAVERS
