National Online Safety Hub

The Australian Government's eSafety Commissioner has just released the National Online Safety Hub. This Hub contains many different resources for parents to access support for themselves, as well as their child, when navigating the digital world. The new Online Safety Hub contains updated and tailored advice, resources and support to ensure your experience in the digital world is positive and productive. The website includes specific areas for young people, focussing on issues such as, cyber bullying; "what do I do if someone is causing drama online?"; receiving unwanted nudes and pressure to send nudes; along with many other relevant topics for young people. This website also has important information on key online safety issues. These issues include, protecting your personal information; image based abuse; as well as online scams and identity theft. The Hub also offers advice and strategies to ensure your child has a positive and safe experience

online, and allows you to report instances of cyberbullying, image based abuse or illegal and harmful content.

Senior Study Leave Passes

The use of Senior Study Leave Passes was explained to parents who attended the Year 11 into 12 Information Night on Tuesday evening this week. Many other important pieces of information was also discussed, to help prepare students for their upcoming HSC. I would just like to remind parents, the Senior Study Leave Pass is a privilege and not a right and will be revoked if your child is found to be doing the wrong thing.

Once students have been allocated a Senior Study Leave Pass, the rules are as follows:

- If you do not have a timetabled class period 1, you may attend school from period 2 onwards
- If you do **not** have a timetabled class period 6, you may leave school after period 5
- To be eligible to leave school throughout the day, you must have at least two consecutive free periods
- Single periods (from periods 2-5) do not qualify
- Senior Study Leave Pass applications occur twice per term, usually in Weeks 2 and 7.

This rating looks at the proportion of students who were satisfied with the overall quality of their educational experience.


