#### PRINCIPAL'S REPORT



#### Visit from Sogeri National High School

Early next week students and staff from our Papuan New Guinea sister school will arrive at Cherrybrook after undergoing a one week induction program in Melbourne.

Mr Townsend, Mrs Lees and Ms Rochford along with students Tashi Gregg and Kaanchana Sekaran, have devised a very full program which will consist of some excursions and a range of in class and in school experiences. Hopefully, the exchange will not only provide Cherrybrook students with a deeper cultural understanding of PNG, but also allow the teachers and students from Sogeri an opportunity to witness some really outstanding teaching and resource development. On Monday 11 November all students and staff at Cherrybrook paused and observed one minutes silence to mark one hundred and one years since the end of World War 1. As always our students were respectful and thoughtful as they reflected on those who had given their life in the service of our country, not just in the Great War, but all conflicts our troops have served in.

# Cherrybrook Technology High School Vaccination Clinic Visit Schedule

#### Friday 29 November 2019

#### Year 7 and 10 Vaccinations

NSW Health will be offering the following free vaccinations to Year 7 and 10 students on Friday 29 November:

Year 7: Human Papillomavirus (HPV) dose 2

HPV dose 1 and Diphtheria/Tetanus/Pertussis vaccine to students who DID

NOT receive it earlier this year

Year 10: Meningococcal ACWY for students who missed it last term.

#### **Consent Forms:**

A new consent form is **NOT** required for Year 7 students having their second dose of HPV nor for students who have handed in their form, but were absent from the previous clinic.

The Information and Consent Form pack is available from the front office for students who have not yet handed in a form. The nurses will **NOT** vaccinate your child unless they receive a parent/carer signed consent form.

Please ensure your child has a good breakfast on the morning of the vaccinations and they wear their sports uniform for ease of vaccination.

Parents/carers wishing to withdraw their consent for any reason may do so by emailing the Head Teacher Student Programs, Mrs Juliet Navarro, on <a href="mailto:cths.nsw.edu.au">cths@cths.nsw.edu.au</a>. #### Science Olympians

Every year the University of New South Wales invites high school students from around the world to participate in a Science exam in one or more of the four main areas of Science; Biology, Chemistry, Physics and Earth Sciences. The exams are known for being a very challenging set of multiple choice, as well as longer response questions, living up to their name as 'Olympiads'. The Olympiads consist of largely skills-based questions focussing on interpretation and communication of data, rather than the recollection of theoretical ideas. The exam is designed to extend the thinking of Science students and provide opportunities for the highest achievers to attend external workshops.

This year the Olympiad was held during the first weeks of August and 35 Cherrybrook students from Years 10 and 11 took part, mostly in Chemistry and Physics.

A total of 61 Olympiad exams were completed, returning some outstanding results including fifteen Credits (top 60% of students) and nine Distinctions (top 30% of students). High Distinctions (top 10% of students) were awarded to Pranav Budhwar, Rishab Iyer, Aalam Virk and Siddhart Kothari. Special mention goes to Xiao Wu who achieved a High Distinction in the Physics exam as well as Distinctions in both Chemistry and Biology. Consequently, Xiao has been invited to attend the 2020 Australian Science Olympiad Summer School. Ms Yang, who has been coordinating the competition at Cherrybrook for a number of years, said this was the most successful year in her memory. Well done and congratulations to all participants.

#### **IMPORTANT INFORMATION!!**

#### **Student Attendance in Government Schools**

Dear Parents / Guardians

When your child is away from school it is important parents comply with the guidelines set out in the Student Attendance Policy, the Student Attendance in Government Schools Procedures, as well as established School Procedures.

Please note the following requirements:

#### 1. ABSENCE FROM SCHOOL

- Parents are required to provide an explanation of absence to the school within seven days from the first day of any period of absence.
- This explanation can take place in the form of an email, text message or written note.

#### 2. TRAVEL DURING THE SCHOOL TERM

- Parents will be required to complete an Application for Extended Leave Travel form and submit it
  to the Principal for his / her consideration. If the Principal accepts the reason for travel, the absence
  will be marked as 'Leave' and a Certificate of Extended Leave Travel will be issued.
- Please note: School Policy requires you to provide the completed Application for Extended Leave -Travel form, along with all necessary documentation, for more than three days absence from school.
- The Application for Extended Leave Travel form can be downloaded from the Parent Portal, located under 'School Documents'. This form **must** be submitted to the student window, **two weeks prior** to the date of departure.
- Before applying for extended leave, it is the responsibility of students to discuss any scheduled
  assessment tasks with the Head Teacher of each of their subjects and check the school calendar for
  timetabled activities.
- Senior student will also be required to submit the Application for Leave Senior Student
   Assessment Amendment Request form.
- The Application for Extended Leave Travel form and Senior Student Assessment Amendment Request form must be submitted to the student window, two weeks prior to the date of departure. Both forms are available from the Parent Portal, located under 'School Documents'.
- If travel leave is taken without prior knowledge of the Principal, the leave will be marked as UNEXPLAINED - UNJUSTIFIED.

#### 3. MISSED WORK, ASSESSMENT TASKS AND MANDATORY PROGRAMS

- It is the student's responsibility to find out and catch up on missed work from their classroom teacher
  or the Faculty Head Teacher.
- Students who seek permission for leave must take into consideration the timetabling of formal
  assessment tasks and mandatory programs such as the Life Ready Program. Students missing a
  formal assessment task can be given a zero (0) result if they fail to complete the tasks at the scheduled
  time. Application for leave during this time may not be approved.
- Students taking leave during periods of formal assessment tasks and mandatory programs may be recorded as EXPLAINED - UNJUSTIFIED.

#### Writers in Residence Program


Year 10 students have received their permission notes for this wonderful inaugural Writers in Residence Program. Please promptly return your completed note, with payment, to the student window.






The P&C and library have generously subsidised this exciting writing program. It is an opportune moment to prepare for the fundamental requirements of the Stage 6 English syllabus.

#### PROCEDURE FOR EARLY LEAVERS


