Cherrybrook Technology High School Vaccination Clinic Visit Schedule

Friday 29 November 2019 Year 7 and 10 Vaccinations

NSW Health will be offering the following free vaccinations to Year 7 and 10 students on Friday 29 November: Year 7: Human Papillomavirus (HPV) dose 2 HPV dose 1 and Diphtheria/Tetanus/Pertussis vaccine to students who DID NOT receive it earlier this year Year 10: Meningococcal ACWY for students who missed it last term. **Consent Forms:** A new consent form is NOT required for Year 7 students having their second dose of HPV nor for students who have handed in their form, but were absent from the previous clinic. The Information and Consent Form pack is available from the front office for students who have not yet handed in a form. The nurses will NOT vaccinate your child unless they receive a parent/carer signed consent form. Please ensure your child has a good breakfast on the morning of the vaccinations and they wear their sports uniform for ease of vaccination. Parents/carers wishing to withdraw their consent for any reason may do so by emailing the Head Teacher Student Programs, Mrs Juliet Navarro, on cths@cths.nsw.edu.au. The Procedure for Withdrawal of Consent is available on the NSW Health website at www.health.nsw.gov.au/immunisation.



Year 12 Students: How to obtain your HSC Results

- On 17 December at 6am: HSC results will be delivered to students via email and text
- On 17 December at 8am: HSC Inquiry Centre is open, phone 1300 138 323
- Enter student number and PIN and follow the prompts
- Remember, your NESA number and Students Online PIN are different from your University Admissions Centre (UAC) number and PIN.

If you wish to opt out of receiving your results by email or SMS, go to NSW Students Online, <u>My Details</u>. You will also be able to access your results that day via NSW Students Online, <u>My Details</u>.

Download your NESA credentials as a free PDF from NSW Students Online, <u>My Details</u>. Your HSC credentials will include an HSC Testamur, Record of Achievement detailing your Year 12, 11 and 10 results, as well as personalised course reports for relevant HSC courses. After downloading, remember to **SAVE** or **PRINT** your credentials, as your NSW Students Online account will only remain open until 30 June 2020.
