High Achievers' Presentation Ceremony

One of the most prestigious events on the Cherrybrook Technology High School calendar is the High Achievers' Presentation Ceremony, which celebrates the HSC achievements of the previous year's Year 12 cohort. In his speech, Mr Johnson updated us on our HSC results, highlighting the outstanding achievements and consistent long term growth in CTHS's results over time. Congratulations to all students on their excellent results. As a school, we are proud of your efforts and celebrate your success with you.

Elizabeth Fuller, Alumni member from the 2013 cohort, gave a wonderful keynote address to the assembly speaking to our Year 12 graduates from 2019 and assembled guests and family members. She spoke of four things which would help them move forward in their careers and life in general. These were:

- 1. Maintain a curiosity and love for learning in whatever you do. Employers love to see staff who are keen to continue a path of learning.
- 2. Ask to be involved in opportunities which present themselves at work and which may interest you. Lizzie is a strong believer in a growth mindset approach and being open to opportunities. Rather than being worried about change, embrace it and take the leap of faith and enjoy the benefits which come from it.
- Surround yourself with people who bring out the best in you. Lizzie spoke passionately about the people she had met through
 her overseas exchanges at the University of Cambridge and University of Peking and the positive role they now play in her
 life on so many levels.
- 4. 'Comparison is the thief of joy.' With so many people using social media these days it's easy to fall into the trap of comparing your life with those of others based on social media posts. It is important to be mindful, the posts you see are probably highlights from people during good times. These are not a true reflection of the ebb and flow of life. Live your life the way you want to and not by comparing yourself to others.

Four salient tips which would be useful to all in life in general. Pleasingly I had a number of students, staff and parents who spoke glowingly of Lizzie's wonderful speech after the event. We thank Lizzie for her involvement in the Ceremony. It was great to see her back and we look forward to engaging with her further in the future on some programs to attract more women into the technology field of work.

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School Photos




Year 7 Swimming Carnival

PROCEDURES FOR SICK STUDENTS
