DEPUTY PRINCIPAL'S REPORT



Staff Development Afternoon

The second Staff Development Day was held on Monday afternoon of this week. The focus for this afternoon was a presentation by Dr Jarrod Cooney Horvarth, Educational Neuroscientist from Melbourne Graduate School of Education, University of Melbourne. His presentation was on *Explicit Teaching* and *Best Practice* conducted over Microsoft Teams. The presentation was thought provoking, very informative and provided specific practical methods for our teachers to implement into their classrooms. Teachers were also able to hone their skills using Canvas to provide a more interactive platform in the classroom for students to engage in their learning.

Tokstori Bilong COVID-19 Celebration and Project WaSH-W Launch

This week we witnessed the launch of Project WaSH-W, as part of the Tokstori Bilong COVID-19, Stories from Papua New Guinea and Australia partnership. This project is based on clean water and sanitation, which is one of the seventeen Global Goals officially known as the *Sustainable Development Goals*. The project will allow students to use specific design thinking principles to come up with solutions to support clean water, sanitation, hygiene and wellbeing in our local area. Our students will be working with students from Sogari National High School in Papua New Guinea across an online platform to develop a prototype to satisfy the design brief. Project WaSH-W will be split up into four sections each focusing on a specific area of the design process. The four areas the project will be based on are:

- Empathy: Students will focus on understanding the challenges around the project and become more scientifically focused
- Definition: Students will complete a map of the school communities to identify where the biggest challenges are
- Ideation: Focuses on the generation of possible ideas to create a solution
- Prototype and testing: Students will build their prototype to see if it works.

United Nations 2020 and Beyond

The United Nations is celebrating its 75th Anniversary this year. As part of this celebration the UN has launched a thoughtful online survey asking individuals for their views on priorities for the future. Considering the world has been turned upside down this year, this may be something you or your family wish to participate in. The online survey will be used to inform the United Nations on the global priorities we are facing in our communities at the moment and the challenges we may face in the future. School Uniform Reminder
