## PRINCIPAL'S REPORT



#### School Excellence in Action

A big thank you to the many parents who have been kind enough to complete the brief survey emailed to them last week.

The results of the survey will help inform our planning for 2021 and beyond, as part of the Department of Education's new School Excellence in Action scheme, whereby all schools will develop a four-year Strategic Improvement Plan in consultation with their community.

Highlights of a preliminary analysis of the results indicate the vast bulk of our community believes our school has very high expectations of our students, that we provide a relevant and broad curriculum and the school

facilities are excellent. Parents were also generally very happy with our teaching staff, the technology used to support teaching and learning, as well as the expectations the school has for student behaviour.

Many parents expressed the view, they were disappointed that, due to the COVID-19 restrictions, the school was unable to hold parent/teacher nights. This is certainly regrettable and the school is planning a technological solution should the current restrictions continue into 2021.

As we further work toward the development of our new plan, I will continue to keep you informed of progress and seek community views and input as appropriate.

#### COVID-19 Safety and Year 11 Attendance

The scanning of Year 11 attendance biometrics will commence late in Term 3 and continue into early Term 4. This will enable student flexible attendance patterns to occur throughout their HSC year. We have established a COVID-19 safe procedure to ensure this is limited to class sized groups and appropriate hand hygiene will be practiced at all times, with hand sanitising supplied. Teachers will be monitoring students during this process and appropriate social distancing will be practised where possible.

#### **HSC Continues at Cherrybrook**

The 2020 HSC external examinations continued this week, with examiners viewing and marking student performances on Monday, Thursday and Friday. The examination was most unusual in the sense that all COVID-19 protection measures were carefully followed, with the examiners and students being very mindful of social distancing requirements and wearing appropriate protective attire. While nervous, students were well prepared and very focussed. Hopefully, their final results will reflect the very hard work they and their teachers, Mrs Lee and Mr Felton, have put in over the past two years.

#### AP2s Continue

Year 11 final exams moved in to the second week of tests this week. Pleasingly, students have continued to apply themselves diligently and cooperatively and demonstrated they are well prepared. Given the many distractions and the uncertainty created by COVID-19, it is a great credit to the students. Hopefully, this positive attitude can be maintained as students finish their exams and commence their HSC courses.

#### Planning for Year 12 Departure

Last Friday I met with all of Year 12 and discussed with them our current plans for their final days as students of CTHS. Student Leaders will meet with their Year Advisers and Stage Head Teacher to work out a variety of activities for their final day, with suggestions revolving around a number of staff/student competitions. Whilst Year 12 have had to forgo a great deal, it is pleasing the Government has now relented and agreed formals can proceed after the HSC exams.

# Stop press announcement: As a result of the Government regulations, the formal will now take place on Monday 16 November NOT Tuesday 10 November as previously advised. The event will still take place at Curzon Hall. Further details to follow.

Graduation will proceed on Thursday 24 September, with details of the evening included in a long letter sent to parents last week. Any Year 12 parent who has not yet received this information should contact the school via email and the school will follow up and provide a copy.

Early this week the school was notified, four of our students have been nominated for the prestigious OnSTAGE event. This is a remarkable effort from a small cohort of Drama students. #### **COVID-19 Sick Student Procedures**

#### COVID-19 Procedure for Early Leave

If a student needs to leave school early, they **must** provide a note from their parent/carer giving reasons for the partial absence. Students must **hand the note** in to the **student window before 8.30am** where they will be issued with a leave pass. They then present this pass to their teacher and leave school at the appropriate time.

Due to the recent COVID-19 directive from the NSW Premier, Gladys Berejiklian, parents/carers are NOT permitted on school grounds unless they have a prearranged appointment. Therefore, please arrange to collect your child from outside the school.

On Thursdays, if you have sport, you **MUST** have your early leave note signed off by a member of the PDHPE staff before presenting to the office.
