2020 Literary Festival

Year 12 Geography Excursion - Sydney Olympic Park

On Friday, our Year 11/12 Geography class undertook a field trip to Sydney Olympic Park to study the Badu Intertidal Wetlands. The wetlands are an important case study of an Ecosystem at Risk, the first topic in Year 12 Geography. The ecosystem is closely monitored and managed as part of the area which underwent considerable restoration work in preparation for the 2000 Sydney Olympics. The wetlands continue to play an important role in cleaning our waterways in an area which was, in the past, severely impacted by human use and pollution. A great day was had by all in attendance and it is great to see students able to partake in excursions again after a prolonged period where everything was on hold due to COVID-19.

Year 6 into 7 Orientation Day

Next Tuesday, 1 December, the students of Year 7 2021 will be attending the Year 6 into 7 Orientation Day and getting their first taste of high school. Sadly, parents won't be in attendance due to ongoing COVID-19 restrictions, but students will be given an insight into what they can expect in 2021 when they attend a variety of classes in the company of the Student Executive Leaders. We look forward to welcoming them to the school.

Mission Australia Youth Survey

The Mission Australia Youth Survey is the largest annual survey of young people in Australia. Now in its nineteenth year, the Mission Australia Youth Survey continues to provide a platform for young people aged 15 to 19 to share their values, aspirations and concerns.

The results of the *Youth Survey* are shared with governments, non-government organisations, schools and social commentators to inform the debate around the circumstances of young people in Australia and to support the development of policies, services and programs which have the needs of young people at their core.

Highlights from the 2020 Youth Survey

This year 25,800 young people participated in the nineteenth annual *Youth Survey*. This landmark report provides invaluable evidence collected during the COVID-19 pandemic about young people's most pressing concerns.

For the first time, **equity and discrimination** is the top national issue for young people, increasing by more than 60% since last year.

More than one quarter of young people reported being unfairly treated in the past year, most commonly due to their gender and race/cultural background.

MISSION AUSTRALIA YOUTH SURVEY 2020

Mission Australia conducted its 19th annual survey of young people aged 15-19 in 2020.

The survey aims to identify young people's values, aspirations and concerns. This year's survey had a special focus on young people's experiences of unfair treatment and COVID-19.

Top 3 factors to securing a job:

- 1. Flexible working hours 75%
- **2.** More jobs in my local area 59%
- **3. Work experience** 42%

Top 3 personal concerns:

- 1. Coping with stress 43%
- **2. Mental health** 34%
- **3. Body image** 33%



More than double the proportion of females were extremely/very concerned about coping **with stress** (56% compared with 25% of males)

Young people were asked to comment on their biggest personal issue experienced in the past year. In 2020, the top 3 biggest personal issues were:

- 1. Education 34%
- 2. Mental health 17%
- **3.** COVID-19 9%

Of the 9% of young people who felt COVID-19 was their biggest personal issue:

- 33% were concerned about COVID-19 and education
- 31% were concerned about COVID-19 in general
- 21% were concerned about COVID-19 and isolation
- 17% were concerned about COVID-19 and mental health

Young people were asked about their experiences of unfair treatment. In the past year:

Of those who experienced unfair treatment:



41%

had experienced unfair treatment due to their gender



30%

had experienced unfair treatment due to their race/cultural background

had experienced unfair treatment due to their mental health

Of those who witnessed unfair treatment:



62%

reported it was due to a person's race/cultural background



49%

reported it was due to a person's sexuality



41%

reported it was due to a person's gender

Recommendations:

- Replicate and fund flexible and alternative learning options for young people.
- End the digital divide and ensure access to reliable internet and devices for young people.
- Focus on mental health prevention and early intervention measures, including online and outreach.
- Implement a permanent increase to income support payments for young people and their families.

- Replicate and fund early intervention. services to prevent youth homelessness.
- Fund youth-specific social housing.
- Develop a new National Anti-Racism Strategy and partner with young people on anti-racism initiatives.
- Put young people at the centre of service design and development.
- Develop a national approach to supporting youth employment.



COVID-19 Sick Student Procedures

Students who are sick during class should see a teacher for written permission to go to sick bay. They must present themselves promptly to the **front office** and politely follow instructions from the office staff, who will then contact a parent/carer when necessary.

Any student exhibiting cold/flu like symptoms, related to an illness, will be sent home and is not to return until a negative COVID-19 result is attained and the student is symptom free.

Please note: Sick bay is used for a short time only. Students should not call their parents in the first instance. Please be advised the school does not supply any medication, including pain killers, medicated creams, eye drops etc.

COVID-19 Procedure for Early Leave

If a student needs to leave school early, they **must** provide a note from their parent/carer giving reasons for the partial absence. Students must **hand the note** in to the **student window before 8.30am** where they will be issued with a leave pass. They then present this pass to their teacher and leave school at the appropriate time.

Due to the COVID-19 directive from the NSW Premier, Gladys Berejiklian, parents/carers are NOT permitted on school grounds unless they have a prearranged appointment. Therefore, please arrange to collect your child from outside the school.

On Thursdays, if you have sport, you **MUST** have your early leave note signed off by a member of the PDHPE staff before presenting to the office.
